

CM's development journey

Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh Shivraj Singh Chouhan has announced his plans to travel different places of State and get first-hand information about the progress of development schemes vis-à-vis the effective working of the administrative machinery. The CM told a meeting of the ministers and senior officials that due to enforcement of the code of conduct, in view of elections from time to time, the development schemes had suffered setback and hence there was need to increase their pace in the larger interest of the State and its people. The dream of turning MP into a golden state has to be realized, emphasised Chouhan.

The CM plans to launch his visits of different places in the State with a review of the venues for distribution of land rights pattas under the 'Make Madhya Pradesh campaign.' Those found guilty of irregularities and corruption would be dealt as per the rules, told the CM. The different departments had been directed to ensure proper implementation of Central schemes. The departments have also been ordered to complete the work of cadre management by Jan 31 and to resume duties accordingly.

Chouhan has called for continuous action against the land-mafia. The CM was informed about action having been taken against 13 tainted committees by registering criminal cases against them. Seven of the office-bearers had been arrested. The money of 63 people had been returned and plots of land provided to 7 people.

The State also has taken precautions against the spread of swine flu disease. Treatment of six people in Bhopal; 14 in Indore and 3 in Jabalpur is going on. Training in swine flu treatment had been imparted to 400 doctors and proper medical arrangements will be made at sensitive spots like the railway stations, bus stands and at airports.

The CM, in his New Year goals, has given special place to the teachers. He has asked for disbursal of salaries to all the teachers by first of every month.
